MINUTE OF AN EXTRAORDINARY MEETING OF KEMNAY COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD AT KEMNAY ACADEMY ON TUESDAY 11th SEPTEMBER 1984.

- 1. The Chairman welcomed everyone and read out the Notice convening the Extraordinary Meeting. She informed the meeting that one reason for the co-option of Dr T Drey to the Council was that he is an Analytical Chemist. If members of the Council go to visit the Mud reprocessing plant at Keith and take with them an analytical chemist, the Waste Services Company may refuse him entry; in view of his specialist knowledge they would perhaps, be loth to let him delve too deeply. Mr Bailey told the meeting that possible toxic waste from the drilling mud would come out of the chimney with the black smoke and disperse over the village if the wind was in a certain direction. Mr Bailey said that the Council should co-opt Dr Drey until the possible election for the vacant seats and use Dr Drey's specialist knowledge to the good of the Community. It was felt that the Waste Company would not be able to stop a member of the Community Council from gaining information even if he were an Analytical Chemist. Mr Bailey's proposal to co-opt Dr Drey was seconded by A Jones and carried unanimously.
- The Chairman told the Meeting that North East Waste Services has its Head Office at Wellheads Industrial Estate Dyce. They were incorporated in 1982 and since that time had submitted no accounts. Mr Bailey said he would speak to the residents near to the plant in Keith and ask them what they felt about it. The Chairman suggested that a group of three Community Councillors should go to Keith. Mr Bailey said he would arrange the trip and telephone the Councillors who had indicated they would be prepared to travel with him.
