Minutes of meeting held on 25th October 1977 at Kemnay School.

The minutes of the previous meeting were passed after it was agreed to an amendment regarding the explosive magazine at Craigmyle. The minute to explain that any objections were solely on the grounds of safety.

Business arising.

Planning subcommittee. It was reported that the decision on the Barratts Scheme at Parkhill had been adjourned for a site visit on 25th Oct., the application for a factory at Midmill was refused, during the discussion on this item the Director of Planning stated that a factory site for Kemnay would soon be identified. The change of use at Aquithie Road was refused. The Secretary reported on a telephone conversation with Mr Kennedy regarding the 21 day rule and it was agreed that the District Council should be informed that we do not consider that we should have to abide by this rule in making comments on planning applications. *Probably 000 21 day rule. accept before meeting*

Aberdeen Structure plan. Correspondence was read regarding this matter and it was agreed that Mrs. Morris and Mr. Hern should attend the meeting in Aberdeen on 3rd November.

Noticeboard. It was reported that the board was about to be erected.

Police meeting. A report was given on the informal meeting with Chief Supt, Gordon and Chief Inspector Took. The members agreed that no further information had been forthcoming and that we should again contact the Chief Constable regarding the need for better policing in Kemnay.

Road Works. It was agreed that contact should be made with the Roads Dept, regarding the ~~liaison~~ before digging up roads.

Community Council News. It was agreed that a subscription to this publication should be taken out in the name of the Council.

New business.

Transport of children to Inverurie Academy. Concern had been expressed at the apparent overcrowding on the buses and the resultant bad behaviour. It was agreed that there was a need for adult supervision and that the size of present secondary school children needed one child to one seat. The matter would be raised at School Council meeting on 23rd Nov., and a letter would be sent to the traffic commissioners.

Informal meeting with Doctors at Kemnay Medical Centre.

Mrs. Morris reported on the changes that were taking place within the Medical centre. A lady doctor now takes one surgery a week and a Child Assessment clinic is commencing on 11th November. The Well baby clinic is very well attended but the Doctors would like to see more women at risk coming forward for cancer smear tests. That is women over 35 years of age or who have 4 or more children. A sex and age register is being compiled so that Doctors can pinpoint people at risk for any illness. It is hoped to publish a similar report in the Newsletter at a future date.

Library facilities. The librarian had asked for the Council's help in obtaining longer opening hours and more staff to cope with the very increased readership.

Rubbish on farmland. It was agreed to write to Gordon District Council regarding this problem which appears to have increased since the closing of the tip at Blairdaff.

Lights in telephone kiosks. It was agreed that we should point out that neither the telephone box in Kendal Road or Aquithie Lane had a light and it was necessary for their proper use.

Exchange of houses. Mr Reid assured that there was a strict procedure for the exchange of council houses.
