MINUTE OF MEETING HELD IN KEMNAY SCHOOL ON THURSDAY 27th NOVEMBER 1980 7.30pm

David Bailey, in the absence of Mrs Milton, took the Chair and welcomed the Members Present who were, Pat Cobb, Hugh Cumming, Ian Dow, Mrs Forbes, Dr Hern, Norman Robertson, Mrs Wainman,

Also in attendance, Councillor McLean Press, Mrs Robertson, Public, Mrs Gill Mrs Brown.

Apologies were received from Stephen Stubbs, William Williams, Leslie McKay Bill Wainman, Councillor Reid.

The Minutes of the Meeting held on Thursday 30th October were read and adopted as a true record, proposed by Hugh Cumming, seconded by Pat Cobb.

Matters arising

- 3 a. In the absence of Mr McKay and Mr Hughes the report on the Park Pavilion meeting was deferred. It is understood that Mr Riddell of the Legal Services Dept will be writing proposals discussed..
- 3 b. The letter on the penalty clause about the Park Pavilion was read to members and after discussion it was reluctantly agreed to accept defeat.
- 3 c. Members reported their findings on 'The Year of the Disabled person' and it was agreed to form a sub committee composed, Mrs Forbes, Dr Hern, Ian Dow, Mrs Wainman, to persue the matter further and report back to January Meeting

- 3 h. Councillor McLean confirmed that the statutory body for considering community facility at Kemnay Academy was the Kemnay Management Committee which at the moment managed the Kemnay Community Lounge at Alehousewells School. At the earliest opportunity a College Council would be formed comprising dual control of the new premises.

At the moment there is an Inverurie School council covering I Inverurie, Kintore and Kemnay schools, with teacher, staff and parent representation. Mrs Wainman assured all present that the meetings of the Management Committee were open to the public and advertised throughout the village. Membership of the working party comprised interested persons and was open to all, and advertised. Councillor McLean also intimated the appointment of the new Rector, Mr Sibbald, who would take up his duties from January 1st, based on Inverurie Regional office. The appointment of deputy rector and assistant head would be made in December. There would be discussion between the Education Dept and the architects shortly.

- 3 e. Councillor McLean reported that the Water Services Dept were investigating the open drain at Alehousewells.
- 3 g. The junction of Riverside/ Station/ Monymusk Roads was hazardous unless great care was taken by all users
Councillor McLean agreed to investigate the possibility of a finger sign on the Inverurie Road at the Glenhead turn. Members thanked him for arranging the Horner Finger sign.

- School crossing patrols, lollipop, for the Academy, letters read, pending Tree planting In the absence of Councillor Reid this was left till next time
- 3 i. Of the 19 replies returned so far on the Information centre 17 were in favour of a trial period. After discussion on suitable premises confidentiality, and manning the secretary was instructed to write to C.A.B., Library, Hall Committee and Church and report back to next meeting.
