

MINUTES OF MEETING OF KEMNAY COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 26TH  
APRIL 1990 IN KEMNAY ACADEMY

1. The Chairman welcomed everyone and the apologies were read.
2. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Proposed adoption: Mr Stock. Seconded: Mr Cumming, passed no dissent.

As the Police were present the order of the Agenda was changed to accommodate them. The meeting was told that only Constable Craigmyle is attached to the village at present. The Police House should be occupied by the end of May. Chief Inspector Mackie thanked the Chairman for his comments in the Annual Report.

3 (a) Matters arising from previous Minutes. Community Council presence at the Kemnay Fair. Mr Stock said he felt it might be a good idea to have a stall or some sort of presence at the fair to tell people what the Community Council is about. Volunteers were called for. Mr Stock proposed and Mr Pashley seconded, passed with no dissent. Some sort of information leaflet to be drafted to hand out. AGENDA ITEM next meeting.

4. Unfinished Business. None.

5. Correspondence received. This was read.

6. New Business. Mr Finnie and Mr Wallace of Norpark were introduced. The Chairman was mindful of the fact that the site is outside the parish of Kemnay but in the past matters affecting the parish but outwith the parish had been discussed if they affected residents of Kemnay. Mr Cumming queried whether a letter would be sent to the Planning Department. He felt our first interest should be with the Kemnay Traders. Mr Finnie then gave his presentation, thanking the Community Council for giving him the opportunity to speak. A long discussion ensued after which it was decided not to make any comment to the Planning Authority. The Chairman thanked Mr Finnie and Mr Wallace for their presentation.

7. District News. Cllr Wainman said that after discussions with British Gas last week, a supply to the Village is not imminent. The District have a video for hire, showing what is being done for various sports in the area. Cllr Wainman said a new corporate image for the District Council is being sought and schools in the district will be asked to enter designs for the new logo. The Chairman outlined the

procedure to be followed by people wishing to replace lead water pipes. Details to go into the Newsletter.

8. Regional News. Cllr McLean has spoken to the Roads Department about the entrance to the refurbished house at Craiglea, the Horner. Mr Mitchell is hopeful that the matter will be resolved.

9. Planning Applications. Mr Evans had given details to the Chairman and these were read out. Mr Keir of Wyness Taxis had three applications - one for a valeting garage, one for erection of two houses on the remainder of the site (outline application) and another for two non-illuminated signs. It was decided to object to all three proposals. Proposed: Mr Cumming, seconded by Mr Wainman. Passed by a majority. There were no other contentious applications.

10. A.O.C.B. (a) Mr Bailey proposed a hearty vote of thanks to Councillor McLean for all his efforts on behalf of Kemnay Community Council over the past twelve years.

(b) Mr Wainman said that at present there are five Local Health Councils in Grampian, but the Health Board proposes merging these into a single Health Council for the whole Region. He asked if we could write to Mr J Kyle, Chairman of the Health Board, objecting to this proposal. Proposed: Mr Wainman, seconded: Mr Stock. Passed with no dissent.

(c) Mr Wainman mentioned a letter he had written for the Newsletter about local officials having "clinics" in the Village. - He asked for a letter to be written to the relevant authorities. AGENDA ITEM next meeting.

11. Next meeting. There being no further business to discuss the meeting ended at 9.45 p.m. The next meeting to be Thursday 31st May 1990.
