

MINUTES OF MEETING OF KEMNAY COMMUNITY COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 28TH  
FEBRUARY 1991

1. Mrs Milton, Chairman, welcomed both the Councillors, the members of the public and P C Reynolds.
2. The Chairman said that due to Easter, the date of the next meeting will be Thursday 21st March 1991 and not the 28th March as stated on the Agenda. Cllr Hunter said as he had some other meetings that night he might be late to the Community Council meeting or perhaps unable to attend at all. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read. Proposed adoption: Mr Moir, seconded: Mr Wainman. Passed no dissent.
3. Matters arising:- None.
4. Unfinished Business - Skateboarding in Kembhill Park. Mrs J Reid introduced herself and said she was the Youth Worker assigned to help the skateboarders. A prepared speech was then read by Miss Sandra Martin. It said they wanted to use the area adjacent to Kembhill Park for their pursuit. They are willing to cease all skateboarding at 10 p.m. They will take it upon themselves to tidy up any litter caused by themselves to the best of their ability. Mrs Reid said that she was the person who went to bed at 8 p.m., with windows open and that she has never had a problem with noise. Mr Wainman said that one of the previous complaints was that there were no toilet facilities and asked whether anyone living in the area would be prepared to let the children use their toilet if the need arose. Cllr Wainman has a form for them to fill in now that they have formed a club and negotiations can be started. The Chairman said that she hoped that the club would prosper and be very successful and wished them all the best.
5. Correspondence received. A letter from Cllr Hunter explaining pavement and road widths in Station Road and also parking restrictions. A letter from Keep Scotland Beautiful - AGENDA ITEM next meeting - National Springclean 19th-28th April 1991.
6. New Business. Cllr Wainman asked if there were enough funds to purchase pooper scoopers. Mr Cumming said there is approximately £157 in hand at present. AGENDA ITEM next meeting - pooper scooper purchase and volunteer to run the scheme.
7. District News. Cllr Wainman said the car park on the Glebeland is now completed and white lines are to be painted on it so that people

can park in an orderly fashion. The surface is strictly for cars and is not suitable for lorries. The Council is still taking action over the taxi business in Aquithie Road. The site is not licenced for buses. The application for two houses is coming up before the Planning Committee next week and the Council is recommending only one be built. Re the letter from Mrs Reid read out at the last meeting the Department's policy will be explained in an article in the local paper.

8. Regional News. (a) Station Road. Cllr Hunter said (in his letter) that it is intended to widen the road by about 1 metre giving 1.8 m footpaths and a 7.1 m. carriageway, to permit two-way traffic and a line of parked cars. The new "no waiting" restrictions at the Grove Road End are in part the result of alterations to an entrance when Littlewood Court was rebuilt and are also needed to preserve sightlines for vehicles emerging from Riverside Road or turning the corner from Grove Road. (b) Removal of rose beds in Kendal Road. Cllr Hunter and Cllr Wainman to try and get this matter onto the Capital Plan although this might not happen this year. (c) After complaints from residents of the lane between Wood Gardens and Kendal Road who are bothered by people turning in their drives, he is hoping to get a "No Through Road" sign erected in the near future. (d) the Nursery provision long requested is now planned for later this year. (e) Mrs Shrago mentioned the bad potholes in Victoria Terrace leading out of the village by Kirkstyle Farm. Cllr Hunter to investigate.

9. Planning Applications. Mr Evans said there were four in all. Nothing contentious.

10. A.O.C.B. The matter of a possible Industrial Site was mentioned. The Chairman asked Mr Evans for his further views on this matter as he had done a lot of work looking for suitable sites. He felt the area by the new sewage works could be zoned on the Structure Plan. Cllr Wainman was unsure as it is in private ownership.

11. Next meeting. There being no further business to discuss the meeting ended at 8.35 p.m. The next meeting which is the Annual General Meeting will be on Thursday 21st March 1991.
